

Apartheid Attacks Trade Unions

Black workers in South Africa and Namibia are on the move, challenging the very foundations of apartheid.

The response of the Pretoria regime has been draconian. Under the cover of the nationwide State of Emergency in South Africa and even more repressive measures illegally enacted in Namibia, trade unionists have increasingly borne the brunt of the State's attacks.

Thousands of trade unionists have been detained, many have been brought to trial and at least four are currently under sentence of death for their alleged actions in resisting apartheid. Trade union buildings have been subject to physical attack and bombings.

Trade unions in Namibia and South Africa have appealed for international solidarity. They need our support now! The Anti-Apartheid Trade Union Committee and Southern Africa the Imprisoned Society (SATIS) have come together to launch a *Joint Campaign to Stop the Repression of Trade Unionists in South Africa and Namibia*, with the aim of mobilising the widest possible support from the labour movement and beyond, in solidarity with the workers of South Africa and Namibia.
