

DON'T PLAY WITH APARTHEID!

DEMONSTRATE AGAINST SOUTH AFRICAN TEAM AT STOKE MANDEVILLE IN I.Y.D.P.

(International Stoke Mandeville Games 26 July - 2 August 1981)

International Year of Disabled People is a United Nations sponsored year. The UN has repeatedly condemned apartheid and called for an end to all sports contact with South Africa. Claims by the South African Sports Association for Paraplegics and the International Stoke Mandeville Games Federation that the South African team is multi-racial contradict United Nations policy, which states:

"...there can be neither adherence to the principle of merit selection nor fully integrated non-racial sport in any country practising apartheid until the apartheid system itself is eradicated."

A South African team at Stoke Mandeville also contravenes the Gleneagles Agreement, signed by Britain and all the other Commonwealth countries to discourage sporting contact with South Africa.
