Jets raid guerrilla base in retaliation for Pretoria bombing

The SADF claimed that 41 were "ANC terrorists", while 17 were members of the Mozambique armed forces. A further 44 were injured, but it was not possible to say how many of them were civilians.

S. AFRICA'S REVENGE

SOUTH AFRICAN jets have attacked an African National Congress base in the Mozambique capital of Maputo in retaliation for the Pretoria car bomb blast which killed 17 people.

Defence Minister Gen. Magnus Malan, quoted by the South African Broadcasting Corporation, said the fighters struck an ANC planning headquarters, a command post, a weapons and explosives' training centre and logistical and supply bases.

He said missile batteries guarding the targets operated by the Mozambique army were neutralised.
