

AA Enterprises is pleased to announce the launch of its own record label AA Enterprises Records.

The first two records to be released are both from the People's Republic of Angola. They represent contrasting styles of modern Angolan music.

The first LP is by the **Kafala Brothers** and was recorded during their visit to London last year. One critic described their concert as "one of the most engaging and beautiful performances that I have ever witnessed for ages". They sing in Portuguese and two of the Angolan national languages: Kimbundu and Umbundu.

The second LP is by **Trio AKA** and is an example of modern urban dance music. The style has been strongly influenced by Congolese and Zairean rhythms. This record was recorded in Luanda.


## BOYCOTT APARTHEID '89 – JOIN THE ANTI-APARTHEID MOVEMENT



Flame Lily wines are marketed by AA Enterprises in association with Vindemias Wines and Spirits of Leeds, the sole importers. For every case of wine that you buy, AA Enterprises will make a donation to the Anti-Apartheid Movement for its campaigning work.
