'MAJORITY RULE IN RHODESIA? NEVER IN A THOUSAND YEARS'

Ian Smith was wrong. The cause of African freedom has triumphed in Zimbabwe due to the tremendous courage of people, but only after years of suffering.

There is a new situation in Southern Africa. Will the victory in Zimbabwe lead on to freedom in Namibia and South Africa? Or will the Pretoria regime be allowed to maintain its illegal occupation of Namibia and to ruthlessly impose the apartheid system on the people of South Africa?

A crucial factor influencing future developments will be the role of Britain and other Western countries – the traditional allies of South Africa.

Mrs. Thatcher has already promised to come to the rescue. In December 1979 she spoke of a chance "to make progress towards ending the isolation of South Africa in world affairs." All supporters of the cause of freedom in Southern Africa have a responsibility to stop such collaboration.

"Southern Africa after Zimbabwe" is the theme of this National Conference convened to focus attention on the situation in Southern Africa, with the aim of mobilising more effectively to stop British collaboration with apartheid and to increase support for the freedom struggle.

**Leaders of the Southern African liberation movements have been invited to the Conference.*

**There will be special sessions on campaigning on Namibia and South Africa.*

**The Conference will be open to representatives of all interested organisations, and to individual observers.*
