On June 26th 1959 the Anti-Apartheid Movement was founded in response to the appeal by Chief Albert Luthuli for an international boycott of apartheid South Africa.

To mark the 25th anniversary of our founding the AAM is calling a National Convention to

- * assess the progress towards freedom in Southern Africa over the past quarter century
- * adopt a Declaration and Programme of Action against apartheid and for freedom in Namibia and South Africa.

NEVER BEFORE HAS THE NEED FOR ACTION AGAINST APARTHEID BEEN MORE URGENT. The South African apartheid regime is committing more and more resources to its military build-up and nuclear weapons programme. It continues its illegal military occupation of Namibia. Its new Constitution attempts to entrench permanently white supremacy and strip the African majority of all citizenship rights. Investment, bank loans, oil supplies and technology from western countries, and especially from Britain, enables the evil system of apartheid to survive. ~~The resistance of the women and men of South Africa and Namibia, in spite of vicious repression, demands the support of democratic people the world over.~~
