# 'NO APARTHEID EXECUTIONS' RALLY

## 11 OCTOBER '89

United Nations Day of Solidarity with South African Political Prisoners

**A**s the people of South Africa defy the apartheid regime and the defiance campaign of the Mass Democratic Movement grows in strength, a key demand to be heard on the streets is 'No Apartheid Executions!'

**Over 70 political prisoners await the gallows in Pretoria Central Prison for daring to oppose apartheid.**

Opposition to the judicial murders carried out by the apartheid regime is growing. Key leaders in this campaign from South Africa and Britain will address the rally.

National and international action can and does save lives. In 1988 the lives of the Sharpeville Six were saved, and during 1989 six trade unionists have been saved from the rope.

**Yet when the apartheid regime believes the world is not watching it can and does use the gallows. Abraham Mngomezulu was executed on 25th May 1989. He is the third political prisoner to hang this year.**

Their lives depend on our campaigning. We must get the British Government to intervene to stop the hangings. We must mobilise maximum popular support amongst the British public to stop the apartheid hangman.

Attend the rally, hear the speakers, learn the facts —  
***then act to help end the killings.***
